What are Group A and Group B subjects? How many do I need to take, and when?

Studies are divided into 3 subject groups:

Groups A and B - general university subjects (artes liberales). You must collect **at least 56 credits** from Groups A and B in total. These credits must be earned within the first four semesters.

• Group A: You must choose at least one subject from each subgroup (a total of at least 4 subjects = 16 credits).

- Language credits: You must use not less than 12 and not more than 24 credits to language studies. If your English level C1 was not recognized with IELTS, TOEFL, etc., you will need to reach this level at the university by choosing an English language course based on your level, as determined by a diagnostic test.
- **Group B:** Introductory subjects from other study programs, which you may choose freely.
- **Group C:** Subjects of the student's chosen study program (specialty). You must pass all of them with a positive final grade; otherwise, you will not be able to successfully complete your studies.

During the semester, you must choose study subjects totaling **not less than** 

**September 2-5**) only through the Student Portal (<u>studentas.vdu.lt</u>). On the registration day, you must register for all 3 specialty subjects + enough subjects from groups A and B so that the total number of credits is around When registering for subjects, make sure that:

- you must register not only for one laboratory work or practical training group, if practical works are provided;
- lectures and labs cannot overlap, meaning that they cannot take place at the same time;
- if you cannot register for a desired lecture/lab work group, look for another one

grade is considered to be either the retake grade or, if you don't retake it, the initial exam grade. If you miss an exam or other assessment without a valid, documented reason, or if


you cheat during an assessment, you will not be allowed to retake it at another time. If you have a justified reason, you must contact the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Informatics within 5 working days after the reason preventing your attendance is resolved. If you miss the exam without justification, 0 grade will be entered in the Students

Portal. A missed exam = a failed course. In such cases, you must retake the subject next semester when it's offered, and pay a fee as set by the university.




